## MAYOR AND COUNCIL

## April 8, 2025 – 5:00 P.M. **MINUTES**

Mayor Joe Bishop and the Council of the City of Pineville, Louisiana, met in regular session on Tuesday, April 8, 2025, beginning at 5:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the City Hall, 910 Main Street, Pineville, Louisiana

- 1. Mayor Bishop called the meeting to order.
- 2. Councilman Dorn gave the invocation.
- 3. Pineville City Marshal Murphy Rachal led the Pledge of Allegiance.

5. A motion was made by Councilman Bouchie and seconded by Councilman O'Neal to accept the minutes of the March 11, 2025, regular meeting as published. There were no comments heard. On vote, the motion carried unanimously.

- 6. The financial report was given by Finance Director, Mr. David Humphries. He reported the Pooled Cash ending balance for the month of March is \$1,264,836. March sales tax was up year-over-year by 14.84% ... over \$187K. Mr. Humphries explained the Occupational Licenses were down 23% because most of them are collected in January and February, with a due date of January 1st. There were no further comments heard.
- 7. Mayor Bishop recognized Pineville Police Officers Denzell Bradley, Chris Busby, Devin Cates, Braxton Cripps and Jessie Sanchez for their life saving efforts during a fire on March 3, 2025. Police Chief Roy Fore explained these officers responded to an apartment fire where heavy smoke and flames were visible. Despite the danger, these officers forced entry to rescue a disabled resident and cleared the surrounding apartments. Mayor Bishop presented them with the Pineville Proud Award.
- 8. Mayor Bishop recognized Pineville Police Officer Hunter Rachal for his life saving efforts during a fire on March 20, 2025, while off-duty. Chief Fore explained Officer Rachal responded to a fire in his neighborhood and entered the burning home to pull the resident to safety, risking his own safety. Mayor Bishop presented him with the Pineville Proud Award.
- 9. PUBLIC HEARING was held for the adoption of an ordinance renewing the franchise agreement granting to ATMOS Energy Corporation (a Texas and Virginia corporation with its principal office in the municipality of Dallas, Dallas County, Texas) and its successors and assigns the franchise and rights to conduct in such municipality the business of acquiring, maintaining, constructing, laying, repairing, removing, replacing, installing, operating, and disposing of a gas system for the sale, transportation, and distribution of natural gas within and beyond the municipal boundaries of the municipality and to the residents and businesses located therein for light, heat, power, and any other purposes and the right to use the present and future streets, roads, highways, alleys, bridges, public ways, and immovable property in such municipality and owned or controlled by such municipality for such purposes; prescribing the terms and conditions to which such franchise and rights are subject; and prescribing the term of such franchise and rights. There were no comments heard.

A motion was made by Councilman Dorn and seconded by Councilman Martin to adopt the aforementioned ordinance. Mayor Bishop explained this is to renew the franchise agreement with ATMOS at the same rate. Roll call was as follows:

PUBLIC HEARING was held for the adoption of an ordinance to amend and modify the Code of Ordinances, Chapter 38, Article VI, Section 38-162, relative to vehicle speed limits including all school zones and an exception for Pineville High. There were no comments heard.

A motion was made by Councilman O'Neal and seconded by Councilman Bouchie to adopt an ordinance to amend and modify the Code of Ordinances, Chapter 38, Article VI, Section 38-162, relative to vehicle speed limits including all school zones and an exception for Pineville High. Mayor Bishop explained this is to increase the speed limit in the Pineville High School Zone from 15 to 20 mph. Roll call was as follows:

There was no Council discussion. Roll call was as follows:

- 12. A motion was made by Councilwoman Frederic and seconded by Councilman Bouchie to introduce/accept for publication an ordinance to amend and modify the Code of Ordinances, Chapter 40, Article II, Sections 40-38, 40-39, 40-40 and 40-41, relative to Rates and Charges to amend an Appendix reference. Mayor Bishop explained this is to correct a "typo" when the ordinance was adopted. There were no further comments heard. On vote, the motion carried unanimously.
- 13. A motion was made by Councilman Dorn and seconded by Councilwoman Frederic to introduce/accept for publication an ordinance to amend and modify the Code of Ordinances, Appendix D Fee Schedule, Sections 40-35, 40-36, 40-40, 40-41 and 40-50, relative to Utility Deposits, Sewer Tap Charges and Other Fees. There was no Council discussion. On vote, the motion carried unanimously.
- 14. A motion was made by Councilman Martin and seconded by Councilwoman Frederic to approve a resolution accepting the Mayor's recommendation to appoint Tim Ledet, Sr, to the Board of Commissioners for Water Works District 3 of Rapides Parish. There were no comments heard. On vote, the motion carried unanimously.
- 15. A motion was made by Councilman Dorn and seconded by Councilman Bouchie to approve a resolution accepting the Mayor's recommendation to reappoint Jerry Cripps to the Pineville Housing Authority. There were no comments heard. On vote, the motion carried unanimously.
- 16. A motion was made by Councilman Martin and seconded by Councilwoman Frederic to approve a resolution declaring the following items in the City Marshal's Office and Public Works, Recreation, and Utility Departments as surplus for the purpose of selling, donating, auctioning, or disposing of as necessary.

A motion was made by Councilman Dorn and seconded by Councilwoman Frederic to approve a resolution instituting a 90-day moratorium on "tiny homes", defined as less than 900 heated square feet. Mr. David recommended the Council pass this resolution to provide his office time to develop an ordinance regarding "tiny homes." In response to a question regarding those "tiny homes" that come in on wheels with axels, Chief of Operations Darrell Basco explained that his research showed in those instances, it would be considered an RV and you cannot live in an RV inside the City Limits. There were no further comments heard. Roll call was as follows:
